INTER HOUSE MATHEMATICS QUIZ COMPETITION

The quiz was held on Thursday 26/01/2023, from 16:30-17:30. A total of 24 questions were administered over two rounds. In round one, all the students participated to answer 14 questions (7 each). In round 2, two of the best from each house competed for honors in the remaining 10 questions (5 each). The maximum duration for each question was 2 minutes. It was a close contest. At the end of the quiz, house 1 emerged winners with 34 points while house two scored 30 points.


AKUKO IFO (IGBO FOLKTALES)


